

Early Intervention Program

Who?

The Corner House Early Intervention Program is open to students ages 13-18 who have had some initial experience with alcohol and other drugs.

What?

Early Intervention is a weekly 8-session open enrollment group to discuss pertinent issues related to alcohol and drug use and provides life skills strategies. The topic specific sessions include:

- Identifying how alcohol & drugs affects who you are as a person
- How to express feelings & emotions without using alcohol & drugs
- The stages of addiction
- Decision-making and refusal-assertiveness skills
- Quitting strategies
- Family communication and transitions
- One parent/guardian session is offered during the eight week program

When?

Monday evenings from 6:00-7:30pm

Where?

Corner House Counseling Center, located at 369 Witherspoon Street, Princeton.

Why and How it Works

Students can begin the group at any point during the eight weeks and continue until they have completed each session. Referrals to the Early Intervention Group come from parents, schools, and the juvenile justice system. The Parent/Guardian session focuses on family policies and communication on substance use and abuse. Parents/Guardians are strongly encouraged to attend.
