Alternate Activities

- The Corner House Student Board, whose members represent all four public and private high schools in Princeton, hosts safe, sober, and fun events that attract hundreds of teens from throughout the community
- Activities include: A Capella Night, All-City Dodgeball Championship, "Friday Nite Live," Job Fair

Project GAIA

- Provides peer leadership and diversity training for Princeton High students to develop workshops that raise awareness and promote harmony in the community
- As catalysts for change and the acceptance of self and others, GAIA leaders seek to strengthen anti-drug attitudes through their "Stop Hate-Promote Peace" campaign

TAG Team (Teen Advisory Group)

- Develops and presents realistic workshops for students and parents on the risks and consequences of substance use/abuse and addictions
- TAG Team members are 11th grade students from the four high schools in Princeton

Parent and Community Forums

- Timely and informative workshops and discussions on alcohol, tobacco, drug use, and a wide array of related topics

Educational Learning Services for the Senior Population

- Outreach and education to the senior population on elder drug misuse and abuse issues, including prescription and over-the-counter medications
